HE FORGOT TO MENTION IT TO U'REN

[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.]
Oregon City, Or., March 21.—Severe condemnation of the proposal made by E. W. Doty before the constitutional convention in Columbus, Ohio, that all laws of Ohio should, by amendment to the state constitution, become automatically dead after being in effect 10 years unless re-enacted, was made here today by W. S. U'Ren, head of the "People's power" movement in Oregon.

"In my opinion," said U'Ren, "all human experience and exercise of common sense condemn Mr. Doty's proposal to repeal all the laws of Ohio at one time and also his proposal to limit the life of a law to 10 years. Wholesale law repealing would be as great an evil as is the American method of wholesale law-making."

"A farmer would think it very poor economy to tear up all his crops every 10 weeks to get rid of the weeds. That is what Mr. Doty's proposal would amount to."

"A proposal to repeal any law should have the same careful consideration that ought to be given to enacting new laws. One is usually quite as important as the other."

"Mr. Doty's proposal, as I understand it, is to repeal all laws without any consideration and then re-enact good ones."

WILL EXECUTE PRESIDENT IF THEY GET HIM

San Antonio, Texas, March 21.—That President Madero, of Mexico, will

be executed if he falls into the hands of the rebels is set forth in a decree signed by General Pascual Orozco, the rebel commander, which was brought here and published today by Melchor Camacho, special envoy of Orozco. Another decree warns American that if the revolution is successful any contracts entered into with the Madero government will be void.

A NOTORIOUS DIAMOND THIEF IN THE TOILS

St. Louis, March 21.—In the arrest here today of Daniel Callahan, post-office inspectors believe they have captured the head of an organized gang of diamond thieves who stole \$100,000 worth of diamonds from Mrs. Malvina Drummond's stateroom on the steamship Amerika in February, 1911, and who stole \$10,000 worth of jewelry in Chicago two months later, killing a man in making their escape.

Callahan is wanted for three other diamond robberies, the robbery of a postoffice sub-station in St. Louis and many other thefts. He is known to have been under arrest at one time in London. Rewards aggregating \$10,000 are on his head.

UNWRITTEN LAW IS AGAIN APPEALED TO

Modesto, Cal., March 21.—Frank Warren Flint, a cleaner and dyer, who was shot down last night by J. L. Walker, of Carson, Wash., is believed to be dying today. Sheriff Dingley has taken his dying statement to be used against Walker in the event of a murder trial.

Flint arrived here last evening at 8 o'clock, and at 8:35 he was locked up on a charge of assault to murder. "My wife, daughter and I lived together happily in Carson, until Flint came to my home," said Walker. "He was a musician and my wife proposed that we board him for music lessons given my daughter. I didn't like the idea, but finally gave in."

"I soon noticed that Flint was buying presents for my little girl. I found with a sickening sensation that the child's affections were being drawn from me. Some weeks later I found Flint and my wife in a compromising position. I put him out of the house, but my wife and daughter eloped with him."

Walker wrote to Modesto, learned that Flint was living here with Flint's family and promptly took a train for this city. He walked straight from the depot to Flint's home and when Flint answered the bell, shot him down.

IF NAME GETS ON THE BALLOT IT MUST STAY

That a candidate after filing his declaration and submitting his petition may withdraw, but that after his name is placed on the ballot cannot, is the substance of an opinion rendered today by Attorney-General Crawford.

The opinion is rendered in response to an inquiry made by County Clerk Fields, of Multnomah county. He says that William Powell, of Portland, after filing his declaration and petition desires to withdraw, declaring that the expenses of conducting the campaign which would elect would be greater than that allowed by the law, and that he wants to withdraw from the field and leave it to those whose conscience is elastic enough to make the necessary expenditures.

TO CONSTRUCT BRANCH LINES OUT OF SALEM

With the filing of resolutions today with Secretary of State Olcott by the Oregon-California Railroad company, authorizing the construction of a branch line from this city to a point on the Woodburn-Springfield branch, between the stations of Macleay and Pratum, and also the construction of a branch line to Cottage Grove, railroad men are predicting that it will only be a short time now until dirt will be flying, and the laying of steel will be in progress.

The building of both these lines was announced some time ago officially, and, while no official announcement has been made, it is known that the company contemplates building a line along the river from this city to Portland. Such a route would only exceed in length that of the Oregon Electric by five miles, as it would make connection at Dayton. It is predicted that within a short time the company will file resolutions authorizing the building of this line. The line will penetrate a region unrivaled for scenery and vast resources.

NOTED CROOK IS CAPTURED AT OAKLAND

Oakland, Cal., March 21.—The man who was thought to be Herman Diehm, the Chicago murderer, and who was arrested here Sunday afternoon after a sensational flight, has been definitely placed by the police department and declared to be James Courtney, alias "Rochester Jimmy," alias James V. Sidney, ex-convict and safe blower, badly wanted in the East for dynamiting the postoffice at New Baltimore, Mich., and for breaking jail shortly afterward at Mount Clemens, in the same state.

The prisoner has admitted his identity, and has stated that he will return to Michigan to answer the two charges without the formality of extradition. Courtney is a well-known character

in the life of the underworld. He served three years in the government prison at Leavenworth for dynamiting the postoffice safe at Indianapolis. With him were two accomplices, Samuel Jackson and John Devlin. Courtney was released from Leavenworth in October, 1906.

VENERABLE HEN THE CENTER OF ATTRACTION

Pasadena, Cal., March 21.—"Old Hen," the 25-year-old biddy belonging to Mrs. Elizabeth Grinnell, is the center of attraction at the show today of the Pasadena Poultry association. Despite her age and the fact that she has locomotor ataxia the hen is far from being a back number, as she laid four eggs last year and is providently mothering a brood of little chicks at present.

When Mrs. Russell Sage was in Pasadena two years ago she was a frequent visitor at Mrs. Grinnell's home, and was so impressed by "Old Hen" that after she returned to New York she sent a check for \$250 to the California Audubon society, to assist extension of its work in the name of this biddy.

WILL PLANT BIG TRACT TO WALNUTS

A deal was closed yesterday by the Oregon Realty company in which C. W. Noble became the owner of 244 acres of fine land southwest of Salem on the line of the Oregon Electric railroad. Mr. Noble will have about 200 acres of the tract planted to walnuts and prunes of the best varieties, under the direction of Harold D. Wahlberg, of Seattle, who will have entire charge of the farm. The land purchased is located in the foothills, and is thought by the new purchaser to be of the very best for the purposes to which it is to be put.

Mr. Noble is greatly pleased with Salem and the surrounding country, which he believes has a great future. His present home is in Ontario, Canada, where he has large interests, but he expects to return to Salem in a short time to make other investments here. He will make a desirable citizen of this community, as he possesses the necessary push and vigor to make a success of whatever he undertakes.
