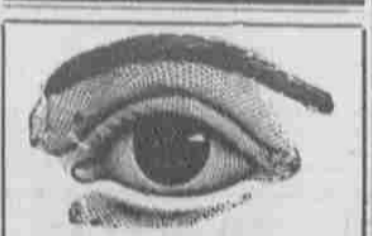
Track Laying Outfit Here—

To Build Canal—
Representatives of the Central Oregon Irrigation Company yesterday afternoon announced to the State Desert Land Board that it had awarded the contract for the construction of the North canal on its project which will connect with the Pilot Butte canal. This will furnish water for the irrigation of 60,000 acres in all. The project is the largest in the state, comprising in all 240,000 acres.

PORTLAND BANDIT MURDERS TWO AUTOISTS

Portland, March 30.—Intercepting an automobile party near Riverdale at 10:30 o'clock last night an unmasked highwayman, armed with a rifle, fatally shot George Hastings, slightly wounded Irvin Lupton and fatally wounded Donald M. Stewart, of 233 East Third street North, who died today. Bruce D. Stewart, secretary of Mann & Stewart company, 341 East Seventeenth street, North, owner and driver of the machine, and H. L. Tab, who resides at the Maitland Hotel and is employed by the Northern Pacific freight department, the other members of the party escaped injury. Donald Stewart and Lupton were each shot in the arm, while a stray bullet pierced Tab's overcoat.
