RECOVERED OF VICTIMS

OF THESE 116 WERE BURIED AT SEA—PITIFUL AND PATHETIC SCENES AS CURTAIN GOES DOWN ON GREAT TRAGEDY.

[UNITED PHERS LEASED WIRE.]

Halifax, N. S., May 1.—Amid scenes f sorrow following upon the arrival here of the "coffin ship," Mackay-Bennett, with the bodies of victims of the Titanic disaster, a number of special cars are preparing to leave here tonight with corpses which are being shipped to resident hipped to various destinations in harge of relatives and friends. All he identified dead will be ready for

the identified dead will be ready for shipment tomorrow.

The Mackay-Bennett recovered 306 bodies, of which 116 were buried at sea. Fifty-seven of those identified were buried at sea and 130 identified ware buried at sea and 130 identified were buried at sea and 130 identified ware buried to Kalifay. Fifteen we were brought to Halifax. Fifteen women's bodies were recovered, of which eight were identified. Eleven bodies women, including four identified, were buried at sea.
