## RECOVERED 306 BODIES OF VICTIMS

OF THESE 116 WERE BURIED AT SEA—PITIFUL AND PATHETIC SCENES AS CURTAIN GOES DOWN ON GREAT TRAGEDY.

Hallfax, N. S., May 1.—Amid scenes of sorrow following upon the arrival here of the "coffin ship," Mackay-Bennett, with the bodies of victims of the Titanic disaster, a number of special cars are preparing to leave here tonight with corpses which are being shipped to various destinations in charge of relatives and friends. All the identified dead will be ready for shipment tomorrow.

The Mackay-Bennett recovered 306 bodies, of which 116 were buried at sea. Fifty-seven of those identified were buried at sea and 130 identified were brought to Halifax. Fifteen women's bodies were recovered, of which eight were identified. Eleven bodies of women, including four identified, were buried at sea.

A pathetic scene was enacted when George Newell, an undertaker brought from Yarmouth, who was busily engaged in embalming bodies, suddenly cried, "My God," and collapsed. He had come unexpectedly upon the body of his uncle, A. L. Newell, who had sailed on the Titanic.

The body of Colonel John Jacob Astor was placed in a private car. Vincent Astor, his 20-year-old son, sat weeping all night beside the casket. Young Astor is on the verge of collapse.

The body of Isidore Straus was placed in an express car with those of seven others. No trace was found of the body of Mrs. Straus.

## MORALS AND HEALTH ARE DISCUSSED

DRS. WHITE, MORSE AND OTHERS DISCUSSED MORALS AND HYGIENE AND NEGLECT OF PARENTS TO TEACH THEIR CHILDREN TO KNOW THEMSELVES.

A meeting of considerable importance was held last night at the senate chamber of the capitol by a number of doctors of the Northwest, which was also well attended by business men and others of Salem. The subject discussed was "Social and Moral Hygiene." The principal speakers were Dr. Calvin S. White, of Portland; Dr. W. B. Morse, of this city; Hon. Geo. H. Burnett, of the supreme court; L. R. Alderman, state superintendent; Dr. William House, of Portland; Dr. L. F. Griffith, and Secretary of State Olcott.

Dr. White spoke at some length on moral education and the relation of the sexes, and was followed by Dr. Morse on the same lines, and both were emphatic upon the necessity of eliminating the false ideas so many parents have about the things proper for them to discuss with their children. Every child should be told the truth about his or her body, God's most perfect creation, instead of being allowed to pick up false ideas, as they naturally will when left to solve all such problems themselves. From the very nature of the discussion, under present social conditions at least, the matters discussed cannot be printed, but it is one that parents will do well to consider and act upon at home.

### NO DAMAGE DONE TO FRUIT BY RAIN

Considerable anxiety is felt among fruit men as to the effect the recent heavy rains are having on the fruit crop. Inquiry has been made of those best in a position to know, with the reply that, unless it is followed by a severe frost, the fruit crop this year will be large. The bad effects of a cold rain at this season of the year cannot be overestimated, especially if the rain comes before pollenization has taken place. Those who know, say that pollenization has taken place in all but a few districts, and the prediction is made that no serious damage has been done to fruit so far.

The church rivaled the Salem out-of-doors for beauty. The lecture room was canopied with white paper streamers garlanded with wonderfully beautiful pink roses. Beneath this was a rose May basket and a May pole which was artistically wound by white robed young ladies. Under an arbor of deep red chrysantheums, two girls, robed in paper gowns to match the arbor, served red punch. One room was transformed into a Japanese scene and magnificent Japanese cherry blossoms were in profuse evidence. Here quaint Japanese maids served tea to the cold and ice cream to the heated. American young ladies dispensed American home-made candy from another booth and American matrons presided over booth of needle work. Wonderfully large and attractive daisies moved about among the guests telling their fortunes from large daisies which they carried. A large frame was erected upon the platform. 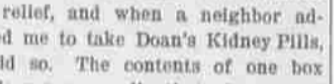
