JAP GOT FOUR YEARS FOR KILLING CAPTAIN

[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.] San Francisco, May 6.—Four years in the government prison on McNeil's island was the sentence meted out today to Senga Okubo, the Japanese cook, who shot and killed Captain Carl A. Benson, of the schooner Americana while at sea last February, by Judge Van Fleet in the United States district court. Okubo, who was convicted by a jury last week, pleaded self-defense, claiming that the captain frequently abused him, and said that when he shot the captain he was klicking and beating him and threatening his life.

JOHN HAYS HAMMOND, THE SCRUB, IN GERMANY
