## THIRTY THOUSAND FOR RACES

Thirty thousand and one hundred dollars will be awarded in stakes and purses at the state fair this fall, according to the speed program prepared by Frank Meredith, secretary of the state fair board. The program is superior to any yet given at the fair and it promises to attract horse men from all over the country.

The program has just issued from the hands of the printer and in full is as follows:

Monday, September 2. 2-year-old trot, Oregon Futurity No. 3, closed; \$900.

2:12 pace, Capital City purse, early closing; \$800.

2:24 trot, Innovation purse, early closing; \$2400.

Running stake race, 4 furlongs for 3-year-olds and upwards; weight 10 pounds below scale; \$200.

Running stake race, 1 mile, for 3-year-olds and upwards; special weights, 3-year-olds 105 pounds, 4-year-olds and upwards 113 pounds; \$200.

Tuesday, September 3. 2:25 pace, Woodmen of the World purse, early closing; \$2400.

2:15 trot, early closing; \$800.

3-year-old trot, Oregon Futurity No. 2, closed; \$2000.

Running stake race, 5 furlongs, for 3-year-olds and upwards; 3-year-olds carry 110 pounds; 4-year-olds and upwards carry 120 pounds; \$200.

Running stake race, 6 furlongs, for 3-year-olds and upwards; weight 10 pounds below scale; \$300.

Wednesday, September 4. 3-year-old pace, Oregon Futurity No. 2, closed; \$1500.

2:02 pace, Greater Oregon purse, early closing; \$5000.

2:30 trot, late closing; \$500.

Running stake race, 5 1/2 furlongs, for 3-year-olds and upwards; weight 10 pounds below scale; \$200.

Running stake race, 1 mile, for 3-year-olds and upwards; weight 10 pounds below scale; \$300.

Thursday, September 5. 2-year-old pace, Oregon Futurity No. 3, closed; \$500.

2:20 pace, late closing; \$500.

2:12 trot, Lewis & Clark purse, early closing; \$5000.

Running stake race, 4 furlongs, for 2-year-olds and upwards; weight 10 pounds below scale; \$200.

Running stake race, 6 1/2 furlongs, for 3-year-olds and upwards; weight 10 pounds below scale; \$300.

Friday, September 6. 2:20 trot, late closing; \$500.

2:08 pace, consolation, \$1000.

Running stake race, 4 1/2 furlongs, for all ages; weight 10 pounds below scale for horses that have started and not been first or second at this meeting, those that have not finished as good as third allowed 5 pounds additional; \$200.

Running Stake Race, Germania Derby, 11-16 mile, for all ages, weight 5-year-olds 105 pounds; 4-year-olds and upwards 110 pounds; \$500.

Saturday, September 7. 2:15 pace, State Fair purse, early closing; \$1000.

Free-for-all-trot, Rural Spirit purse early closing; \$1000.

2:12 trot, consolation; \$1000.

Running stake race, 5 furlongs, for 3-year-olds and upwards; weight 10 pounds below scale; \$200.

Running stake race, 7 furlongs, for 3-year-olds and upwards; weight 10 pounds below scale; \$300.

Conditions. The main race of the \$5000 purse for 2:12 trotters will be for \$4000, with a handicap entrance fee on this amount as follows: Horses with records of 2:11 1/4 to 2:15, \$200; 2:15 to 2:18, \$150; no record or slower than 2:18, \$120.

The main race of the \$5000 purse for 2:08 pacers will be for \$4000, with a handicap entrance fee on this amount as follows: Horses with records of 2:07 1/4 to 2:12 1/4, \$200; 2:12 1/4 to 2:17, \$150; no record or slower than 2:17, \$120.

A consolation purse of \$1000, free entrance, will be given in each of the \$5000 stakes for non-winning starters, provided there are eight or more starters in each of the main events.

The entrance fee in both the 2:24 trot—Innovation purse and 2:25 pace—Woodmen of the World purse, will be 5 per cent of purse. These races will be in three heats each, and every heat a race, money divided after each heat as follows: First money \$400, second money \$200; third money, \$120; fourth money, \$80; \$40 will be deducted from money winners in each and every heat.

General Conditions Governing Harness Races. Closing dates for entries are as follows: Early closing events, Monday, July 15th. Late closing events, Tuesday, August 20th.

Entrance fee, 5 per cent of purse, and 5 per cent from money winners payable as follows: On early closing events, 2 per cent payable on stake

date given and final 3 per cent payable on date named for closing of purse events.

An entrant who has made the two per cent payment may declare out any time prior to August 15th by the payment of one per cent additional, but an entrant who has not actually paid the two per cent cannot avail himself of this privilege and will be held for the full five per cent.

All races mile heats, three in five (except the two and three-year-old races, which shall be mile heats, two in three), and no race shall be longer than five heats, and money is payable according to summary at end of fifth heat: Division—Fifty, twenty-five, fifteen, and ten per cent of purse.

The right reserved to declare off any race that does not fill satisfactorily, to change the order of program, to postpone, and to call two starters a walkover, and the contest will be for the entry fees paid, divided 70 per cent to the first horse and 30 per cent to the second.

Owners may enter two horses from one stable by the payment of one per cent additional for that privilege, due when entry is made, but only one per cent additional for the privilege, due when entry is made, but only one horse can start except where proper transfer is made according to rule and full fee paid on each entry.

Rules of National Trotting Association to govern, except where otherwise specified.

Conditions Governing Running Races. Entries to close in all stake races, Tuesday, August 20th.

Entrance fee five per cent of stake, and five per cent from money winners.

No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by five per cent entry fee.

Right reserved to declare off any race that does not fill satisfactorily, to change order of program, or postpone.

Money divided 70, 20, and 10 per cent.

Weight governed by California Jockey Club Rules.

## PORTLAND EUGENE EASTERN

EXECUTES A COUP ON FIRST STREET, CORVALLIS, STEALING A MARCH ON THE OREGON ELECTRIC—WILL HAVE TO ACCEPT THE COMMON USER PRIVILEGE.

C. L. Southwick, chief engineer of the Portland, Eugene & Eastern Railway Co., with present headquarters at Corvallis, early yesterday morning, with the consent of the city council's street committee, and City Engineer Beardsley, under the franchise recently granted the company, made a grand coup on First street, which their recent franchise covered, staked out their right of way alongside of the S. P. line, whose franchise is an old one, and by so doing cut out the Oregon Electric Railway Co., which also has a franchise on Front street.

The P. E. & E., occupying the middle of First street, leaves the O. E. to lay its tracks on the west curb of the street, overlapping the sidewalk.

The P. E. & E. franchise has the "common user" clause in it, and, by paying its share of the cost of construction and maintenance, the Oregon Electric can use the P. E. & E. tracks through the city of Corvallis.

All the O. E. desires is an entrance to, and outlet from Corvallis, as a part of its through line from Portland, via Albany to Eugene.

Just too late to witness the coup of the P. E. & E. official, the newly-elected president of the Oregon Electric, who is also president of the North Bank, Oregon Trunk and United Railways, J. H. Young, who succeeds Carl R. Gray, recently elected president of the Great Northern railway, with headquarters in St. Paul, arrived in Corvallis in his private car. Mr. Young was accompanied by Judge C. H. Carey, general counsel of the Hill lines; W. E. Coman, general freight and passenger agent; L. B. Wickensham, chief engineer, and L. B. Griswold, resident.

President Young, in a short interview at the Julian hotel, stated that they would have to take advantage of the P. E. & E. "common user" clause, as there would be no room on First street for a third track.

He added that their proposed bridge across the Willamette river at Corvallis could not be built this year, as the "false work" in the river could not be
