San Diego, Cal., May 29 .- That the American refugees on the United States transport Buford, due here late today, are not all destitute, as reported, was indicated in a wireless essage to Mayor Wadham today. Although a few are in need of imediate work, and penniless, it is beeved that the majority do not need assistance. Of the 360 on board, only 18 men, nine women and 15 children are to be left in San Diego, the maycr's message says. One man with a family of six is in need of work at once, and this will be supplied. All will be quartered at the army barracks here, if they care to accept the hospitality of the city.
