## THEODORE WILL GO TO CHICAGO

HIS MOST INTIMATE FRIENDS SAY SO, BUT HE HIMSELF IS SILENT—TAFT'S MANAGER INVITES THE COLONEL TO BE PRESENT.

[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.] New York, June 7.—Colonel Theodore Roosevelt's closest friend here today declared that the former president will go to Chicago Wednesday, and will undoubtedly run for president at the head of a third party, unless some of his contestants are scotched by the national committee.

It was said that arrangements for Roosevelt to bolt the convention have been completed. It was declared that the colonel is ready to fight to the last ditch.

When asked personally today if he were going to Chicago Roosevelt reiterated that he did not know. He took luncheon today with James E. McField, of Ohio.

Teddy's Invited.

Chicago, June 7.—Advices received here today state that State Senator Flinn, of Pittsburg, is on his way here as Colonel Roosevelt's special representative. He, with Walter Brown, of Ohio, will work among the delegates to the national convention, and will keep them impressed with Roosevelt ideas.

William B. McKinley, President Taft's manager, issued a statement today "inviting" Colonel Roosevelt to come to Chicago.

## AN AMERICAN IS MURDERED IN HONDURAS

Washington, June 7.—Frederick Pierpont Shaw, an attorney of Chicago, was assassinated on the Black River, near Triota, Honduras, according to dispatches received here today by the state department. The assassin was captured. No details of the crime were given.

## COMMERCIAL TRAVELERS ASSOCIATION

Portland, Or., June 7.—The United Commercial Travelers' association of the Northwest opened their annual two days' convention here today. About 1,000 delegates and families from all parts of Oregon, Washington and British Columbia were in attendance.

## WILL HAND CASE BACK TO HANFORD

Tacoma, Wash., June 7.—J. W. A. Nichols, Attorney for Leonard Olsson, disfranchised from citizenship by Judge Hanford, will secure Olsson's signature to the papers this evening and file them in federal court tomorrow to try to re-open the case. Judge Hanford will be asked to vacate his decree of disfranchisement, and either dismiss the case or grant a rehearing so that complete testimony may be taken for transcript for an appeal.

## LIGHTNING GETS BUSY IN OREGON

### FIERCER ELECTRIC STORM AT GRANTS PASS—THE LIGHTNING STRUCK TRANSFORMER HOUSE, AND PUT LIGHTS AND POWER OUT OF BUSINESS.

[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.] Grants Pass, Ore., June 7.—The transformer house of the local light and power company was struck by lightning just before noon today, and the city is without electric light or power. Three of the six main transformers were burned out, and the building and switchboards, were wrecked. The three remaining transformers will be put in commission as soon as possible, and current electricity may be on again tonight. Today's thunder storm was the most severe on record here, the lightning flashes being continuous. No other damage is yet reported. The heavy rainfall was of great benefit to growing crops.

Brussels, June 7.—Many persons were injured in the Borlinga district today when strikers fired on a body of strikebreakers. The streets and railroad stations are patrolled by soldiers but the strikers refuse to be cowed.

## STRIKE IN BOSTON IS A HOT ONE

[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.] Boston, June 7.—The rioting following street car strike continued throughout the day. Crowds which gathered in front of the Union headquarters refused to disperse until the police threatened to charge. At noon the company restored some semblance of order. In some instances the crews left crowded cars between stops and reported to the union headquarters. At 1 o'clock this afternoon, less than half the usual cars were running between Boston and Cambridge. At that hour a total of 40 arrests had been made.

## A PAROLE FOR RUEF IS HUNG UP

[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.] San Francisco, June 7.—Superior Judge W. P. Lawlor, who sentenced Abe Ruef to 14 years in prison, has taken the position that the time has not yet arrived to favor a parole for the former political boss of San Francisco. When a document was presented to Judge Lawlor, stating that the signer was unopposed to Ruef's proposed application for release on parole, Judge Lawlor declined to affix his signature making the foregoing statement. District Attorney Charles M. Fickert had already signed the paper, attesting to one formal statement that no indictments remain on the calendar against Ruef and to another stating that he makes no opposition to Ruef's effort to secure parole. Lacking Judge Lawlor's signature, it is probable that Ruef's application to the prison board that he be given a chance to present arguments for parole, will not come before that body at its monthly meeting tonight. Ruef's attorneys stated today that it was hardly probable that the matter would come up, as the case had not been placed on the prison board calendar. This was before the Lawlor incident. Ruef has now served about 15 months of his term.

## THE BRIDGE COMMITTEES CONSIDER IT

A conference was held this morning at the court house between the county courts of Marion and Polk counties and the bridge committee of the city council of Salem, at which it was practically agreed to put a watchman on the bridge to prevent overloading the bridge over the Willamette river here. The report of the experts who examined the bridge about a month ago was read. It showed that there was danger of overloading, and that loads of over eight tons should not be permitted, especially if confined to a short space on the bridge. The purpose of the watchman will be to prevent such an overload or from speeding or from more than a certain number of stock being driven over the bridge at once. It often happens that a large number of stock are driven over the bridge in a drove, or that much heavier loads than should be permitted are taken over the structure, and there is no one to stop it.

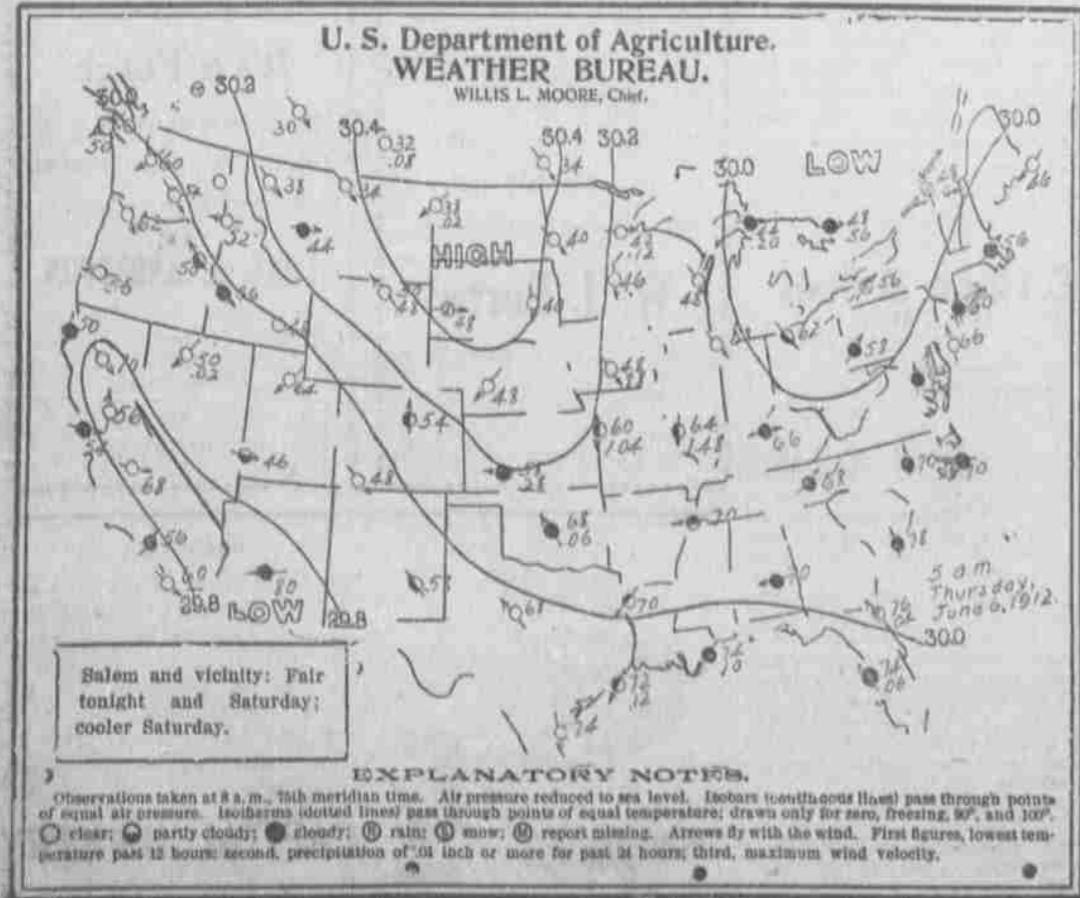
## THE SUPREME COURT SUSTAINS THE ORDINANCE
