**11,000 DEAD CORPORATIONS IN THE STATE**

That letters so far received from corporations in the state in reply to a request for their annual statement show that about 25 per cent of them have failed to make the declaration made today by C. D. Babcock, clerk of the corporation department of the office of secretary of state, and should the rate continue, the governor will under the law be compelled to dissolve about one-fourth of them.

In all there are 18,000 corporations on the books of the corporation department, but only 7,000 of them are alive and engaged in business. With 500 of them so far reporting having gone into bankruptcy or into the hands of the receiver, the number is destined to be considerably reduced if the rate keeps on. Though the 11,000 dead corporations have been dissolved by the governor, it is necessary for the clerk to keep their names on the books, for they are subject to re-instatement whenever they desire to resume business. One bad feature of the law along this line is that it prevents any new corporation from assuming any of their names. The law at one time provided that when a corporation had been dissolved for two years, that its name should go off the books, but this law has been amended so that they can remain on them now indefinitely. An effort will be made to amend this feature of the law at the next legislature.

**IT CANNOT USE GAME FUNDS TO PAY BOUNTIES**

In an opinion rendered by Attorney General Crawford at the request of the secretary of state, it is held that the state game and fish commission can not legally use funds belonging to the game and fish protective fund and to pay an additional bounty for scalps of cougars and wild cats.

The scalp bounty law provides that when either animal is killed that the county clerk will pay a bounty upon the presentation of the scalp. Anxious, however, to stimulate the extermination of the animals, the commission offered an additional bounty of \$10 for every scalp, but the attorney general holds that the money can not be used in this manner but only to propagate and protect the game and fish of the state.

**HUMPHREYS CASES WILL BE APPEALED**

With a stay of execution granted yesterday, attorneys for Charles and George Humphrey, convicted and sentenced to hang for the murder of Mrs. Eliza Griffith, are now free to prosecute an appeal to the supreme court.

The action takes from the shoulders of Governor West the necessity of acting on their reprieve pending a vote on the anti-capital punishment bill, of which he is the author, and which he will have placed on the ballot this fall.

Prison authorities declare that both prisoners have shown no concern, despite the fact that the time for their execution was rapidly approaching. Two reasons are assigned for this. Some declare that they are too ignorant to appreciate the gravity of the situation, and other declare that they realize that Governor West would never permit the noose to fasten itself about their necks until the people have voted on the question of abolishing capital punishment.

**DECEIVING THE SIGNERS SAYS MR. NALE**

E. J. Naale, a member of the typographical union here, and also a member of the state printing force, makes the declaration that circulators of an amendment which it is sought to have initiated amending the state printer's flat salary bill are deceiving signers into the belief that the amendment, if passed, will not put the original bill into effect until after the expiration of the term of State Printer Dunlavy.

Prior to an element of the local union opposing its action in voting to use funds belonging to the union to assist in financing the bill, he declares, but little interest was paid to the matter. That, however, he says, has called the public's attention to the subject, and reports are rife to the effect that circulators are making misrepresentations of the facts to signers.
