

OLD PAGE IN NATURE'S BOOK TURNED IN NEVADA'S DESERT

Reno, Nev., June 11.—With the discovery of the remains of extinct camels of the miocene period, the unearthing of a three-toed horse which was evidently about the size of a large dog, the discovery of a pre-historic dog, computed to be about 5,000,000 years old, a scientific exploration expedition, headed by Professor Lawrence Baker, of the geological and paleontological department of the University of California, has made astounding discoveries in the desert region 18 miles due east of the little town of Mina, Nev.

Where the walls of shale or gravel have been cut by water, leaving the various strata exposed, perfect specimens of pre-historic animals are shown. At one point the remains of a dinosaur are plainly discernible for a distance of 15 feet, while both extremes of the ancient mammal are imbedded in the debris. Professor Baker is first assistant to Professor Merriam, said to be the greatest authority in the world on pre-historic animals.

Specimens Almost Perfect.

The result of Baker's investigations, which are being made with the assistance of Professor Buwaldo, of the University of California, will be submitted to Professor Merriam. So nearly perfect are the relics that no trouble will be experienced in obtaining specimens, which will be sent to Berkeley, Cal. Professor Baker says that the formation is what is scientifically termed upper miocene. The geologists are now bending their efforts to find specimens of the mammoth water lizards which existed in the miocene period and which are the earliest forms of vertebrate life, which scientists have ever unearthed.
