cause he believed the small college afforded the poor young people the best chance.
He also gave largely to charity and for 50 years aided young men to get an education.
Dr. Pearsons gave away every dollar of his big fortune, reserving only a small life annuity to keep soul and body togeth-
er till death. He was doubly successful.
