WOULD HOLD PRESIDENT TO ONE TERM

[UNITED PRESS LEARNED WIRE.] Washington, Aug. 19.—The senate debated the resolution of Senator Works, of California, which proposes an amendment to the constitution making the presidential term six years instead of four, and providing also that no president shall be eligible to re-election. Speaking in support of the measure, Senator Cummins, of Iowa, said: "It is the duty of every one who respects the rights of the people to vote for this resolution. The high office of president should be free from influences and coercion. The president should be free to perform his whole duty, having no other thought than to enforce the laws which contribute to the welfare of the people."

IS KILLED BY BLAST IN QUARRY

[UNITED PRESS LEARNED WIRE.] Cottage Grove, Or., Aug. 19.—Daniel Boyle, a railroad employe, was killed and several persons narrowly escaped death in a blast at the city rock quarry here. Boyle was killed by being hit on the head by a heavy stone thrown 1000 feet from where the blast was set off.

Ridicules Statement.

[UNITED PRESS LEARNED WIRE.] Washington, Aug. 19.—Replying to a statement issued by President Francisco I. Madero, of Mexico, that his encouragement of rebel activity in response to the continuation of the Mexican rebellion, United States Senator Fall, of New Mexico, in the senate today stamped Madero's charge as absurd and ridiculous. Madero, he said, unable to cope with the situation, is attempting to shift the blame elsewhere.

ONLY ONE BULL DOG OF THE SEA

[UNITED PRESS LEARNED WIRE.] Washington, Aug. 19.—The senate and house conferees on the naval appropriation bill agreed today on a compromise of the battleship controversy on the basis of one vessel to cost \$15,000,000. This is expected to end the dispute. The vessel to be built will not be a super-dread-naught, as originally proposed.

The senate adopted the conference report on the naval bill. The house is expected to adopt the bill later in the day, and the measure will probably go to President Taft tomorrow. Senators Thornton and Lodge vainly attempted to have the senate insist on two battleships.

The conferees retained the provisions for six submarines, a \$1,000,000 wireless system embracing Panama, the Philippines and Hawaii, two colliers and 4000 additional enlisted men for the navy.

MEXICAN BANDIT IS READY TO GET BUSY

[UNITED PRESS LEARNED WIRE.] San Diego, Cal., Aug. 19.—The Mexican bandit, Tobo, has attained an unenviable record because of his depredations along the border during the last year, is reported to be in the field again across the Mexican line near this county with a band of seventy-five desperadoes. Tobo is said to have committed several murders along the border in the year, but he got his reputation for desperate outlawry during the recent peninsula insurrection. The report that he is at large again and preparing for more depredations, is causing no little worry to the Mexican officials. There are rumors that the rebel leader General Orozco plans to make a dash to the west to meet Tobo.

ARGUING MOTION TO DISMISS

[UNITED PRESS LEARNED WIRE.] Los Angeles, Cal., Aug. 19.—Arguments on a motion by Earl Rogers to dismiss indictment pending against Clarence S. Darrow, will be heard by Judge Hutton tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock.

Rogers moved the dismissal of the indictments today when the case was called to be set for trial. His ground was an allegation that the trial had not been set within the 60 days-limit prescribed by law. The indictment charges Darrow with bribing Robert F. Bain a juror in the McNamara case.

SUSPECTED OF BEING A ROBBER

[UNITED PRESS LEARNED WIRE.] New Westminster, B. C., Aug. 19.—Dean, the man arrested in Los Angeles on a charge of complicity in the robbery of the Bank of Montreal here, will make his second appearance before the police magistrate tomorrow, when it is expected the case will be proceeded with. The police think they will be able to show that Dean lived in Vancouver last fall at a house on the corner of Pine and Broadway, the other tenants of which were a Mrs. Griffin and her two daughters.
