

LAUGH THAT ROLLS INTO A THOUSAND

"BABY MINE," WHICH COMES TO THE GRAND SATURDAY, IS ONE OF THE GREATEST LAUGH PROVOKERS EVER PUT ON THE STAGE.

This the universal opinion of everybody who has seen "Baby Mine," the product of Margaret Mayo's pen, under the direction of William A. Brady, which will again be seen here on Saturday evening, September 21 at the Grand. This is just the sort of a play to turn tears into laughter, and to give life a rosy hue, so sayeth one of England's most famous critics where "Baby Mine" scored a whole year's run at Sir Charles Wyndham's theatre in London, and it should be borne in mind that over in London town they have heretofore held a strong prejudice against plays of American manufacture, so this superlative praise in favor of "Baby Mine," is all the more remarkable.

"Baby Mine" unlike many so-called fun plays, gets a hold of the funny-bone of its audience at the very outset and proceeds to tickle it for two and one-half hours, not moderately, nor modestly, but boisterously and strenuously until the audience fairly shouts with glee. A young married couple are quarreling at the very beginning of the performance. In a towering rage the young husband leaves the house, and remains away for three months, after which period the clever young wife makes up her mind that woman's ingenuity should be sufficient to formulate a scheme to bring back her wandering better half. The wife consults a friend, who opines that wife wire the absent husband that he is the proud father of a lusty infant, and the friend volunteers to hire a baby for the occasion. A child is secured for the purpose, but the husband appears on the scene sooner than expected and even before the child is brought into the house. In the meantime the real mother of the baby is seized with remorse and demands the child back. Again the friend rushes off to get another baby, and it is in the subsequent complications incident to the arrival and rescue of this child that the complications take on an amazingly amusing aspect. The fun, once started, is kept up to the very end of the comedy with never a suggestion of a let-up. Throughout the entire three acts the fun of "Baby Mine" is of the clean, wholesome, cheerful sort, with never the least bit of suggestiveness to mar the enjoyment of the performance.

"AWAKENING OF HELENA RICHIE" AT THE GRAND

IS PRONOUNCED THE PRE-EMINENT ATTRACTION ON THE AMERICAN STAGE TODAY—IT DELIGHTS EVERYBODY.

From Ernest Shuter: Roselle Knott in "The Awakening of Helena Richie," one of the pre-eminent attractions of the American stage today, will be this season's attraction at the Grand opera house Thursday, September 19th, tonight.

"The Awakening of Helena Richie" ran for one solid year in New York, nine months at the Tremont theatre, in Boston, seven months at the Illinois theatre in Chicago and several months in Philadelphia, and this is its third tour; and within a short time it will have extended engagements in Europe and Australia, the same as it is now having in our own United States. "The Awakening of Helena Richie" is a distinct novelty, insofar as its theme is concerned. The plot was conceived and written by Margaret Deland, and dramatized by Charlotte Thompson, and it is so brilliantly staged by Roselle Knott that the production must be classed as magnificent. Even in these days of lavish expenditures, the settings are splendid. From the first to the last scene, the stage settings and environments are rich, colorful and artistic, and the light effects beautiful. To write a play that will continue as a vehicle of popular entertainment, throughout the vicissitudes and changing public moods, implies that it contains some particular elements that enable it to make wide appeal to a vast number of people, though as a matter of fact, it does not necessarily follow that such a play is a great piece of dramatic writing. On the contrary, the generally successful play in a majority of cases lives for the simple reason that it reaches the hearts of the people, that great mass of individuals who go to make the vast army whose approval and patronage is what makes the modern drama an assured fact. Such a play is "The Awakening of Helena Richie" as played by Roselle Knott, supported by Henry Hall, late star of Liebler's production of "The Man From Home." You must, in the long run, give the public the sort of plays it wants and "The Awakening of Helena Richie" is one of them. Such plays are like rare jewels—difficult to get into one's possession—and then not always recognizable to even the most intelligent mind, until they have been examined under a strong light, which, in cases of plays, is to be found in public presentation. The public is a merciless critic, its palate is delicate and must be tickled with the sort of dramatic dish that will not clog nor leave an unpleasant taste behind.

(UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.) Tacoma, Wash., Sept. 19.—Tacoma is to have a new hotel to cost in the neighborhood of \$1,000,000. Approximately that amount subscribed by business men, is now in the hands of the chamber of commerce. An option on a site has already been obtained. According to Secretary T. H. Martin the hotel is to be "first class in every respect and conducted in a manner such as to become known throughout the country as one of Tacoma's attractions for tourists."
