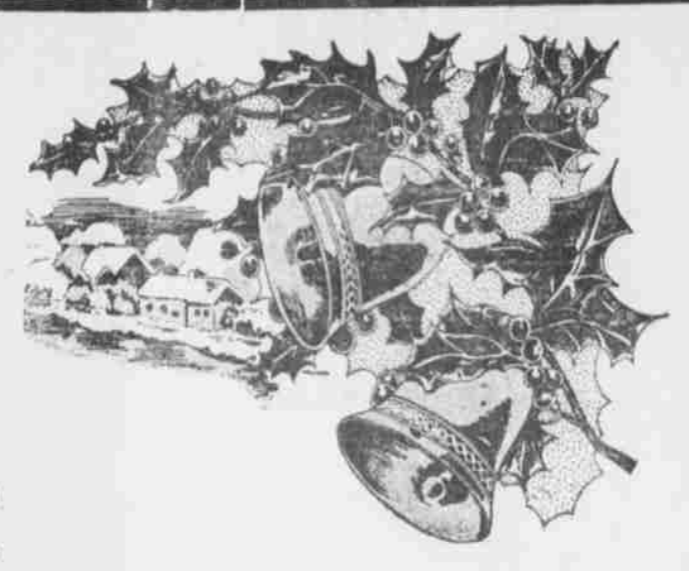

SOME PIECES OF THREAD
MAY CONVICT JONAS

San Francisco, Dec. 11.—Tiny strands of cloth, scarcely discernible to the naked eye, today form strong circumstantial evidence, the police say, against Joseph Jonas, suspected of murder of his aged mother, Mrs. Lena Jonas. The strands of cloth, the police say, were found on Jonas knife blade. Microscopic examination showed them to be of red cloth, and, according to the police, Mrs. Jonas wore a red cloth belt, from which was suspended her jewel bag. The coroner's jury continued today its investigation of the alleged murder. It is expected that all the evidence will have been submitted before night.

DIET OF TYPHOID
AT OREGON CITY
