Rev. William Robinson, one of Salem's oldest and most respected ministers, passed away last night at his home, corner Mill and Winter streets, after an illness lasting but a few hours. He had been troubled with his heart for several weeks, and was just able to be about the house yesterday, without the aid of the nurses of his wife. He laid down last night and Mrs. Robinson was reading the scriptures to him, when he suddenly complained of a pain in his head. With the remark, "I guess this will be all," the old soldier passed beyond.

Mr. Robinson was a very active citizen. Notwithstanding he was 85 years old, he took part in city affairs and performed many good deeds for Salem and its people. He was a leading member of the local corps of the G. A. R., and was highly thought of by his fellow veterans.

The funeral will take place from the First Presbyterian church tomorrow at 2 o'clock p. m.
