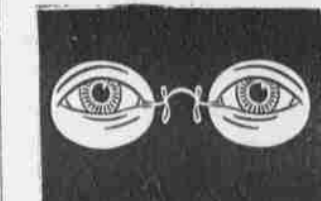

the people as the nomination of Malarkey, after his questionable record. He declared that Malarkey had nominated himself, and that he had been seconded by the Oregonians. In favor of the interests and against the people, stormed the speaker, he had retarded progressivism. Joseph dealt a stiff blow at the public utilities bill fathered by Malarkey, and made a law in the November election.  
The "chameleon record" of Senator Malarkey, as it was termed by Joseph, was delved into deeply, Joseph declaring that he had helped to rob "poor old Marquam." In advocating bank bills in 1910 in the interests of the Title be," returned Neuner.
