Senate Refuses Fair Bill.

The senate this morning refused to concur in the house amendment to the Panama-Pacific bill, the clipping of \$50,000 from the \$200,000 approved by the senate. Senators Moser and Bean were appointed by President Malarkey to confer with members of the house on the bill. At 3 o'clock this afternoon the house and the senate will meet jointly to do honors to the memory of George Washington.

MASTER FISH WARDEN CLANTON EXONERATED

Special Investigation Committee of Legislature Finds That There Was No Mismanagement.

Senator Butler and Senator Smith of Josephine, and Representatives Handley and Barton in a special committee report to the senate yesterday afternoon exonerated Master Fish Warden Clanton, after having carried on an investigation of conditions at the Bonneville hatchery. Representative Pierce, who also a member of the committee, did not sign the report, claiming that an investigation was unwarranted. He is favorable to Clanton, however, and commends his work.

The report follows in part: "That we have investigated the Bonneville fish hatchery, located at Bonneville, Oregon, and have carefully investigated the charges which have been made against the management of said fish hatchery and the members of the board of game and fish commissioners, and find that said charges have not been sustained. We have given hearings in order that testimony might be produced tending to prove said charges, and the only definite charges that have been made were the charges made by Representatives Gill and Schubel that the concrete work in the fish ponds of said hatchery were faulty, but that said representatives merely gave said statements as their opinions and not as experts, and that there was no evidence introduced to corroborate their statements and charges in that respect.

"We further find that some fish have been lost, but that the same was not due to any fault or mismanagement on the part of the board of fish and game commissioners, or fish warden, R. E. Clanton.

"We further find that said fish hatchery has been managed in an economical and businesslike way and manner, and whatever fault there may be in the construction of the concrete work of said fish ponds was only such as might happen under any ordinary circumstances, and that the board of fish and game commissioners and the said fish warden are in no way to blame for same, and that if any fault exists in said construction, the cost of repairing the same is insignificant, and

"We further report there was no cause or excuse for this investigation and that the charges generally have failed of substantiation and we heartily commend the work of the board above mentioned and Fish Warden R. E. Clanton in the conduct and management of said fish hatchery.

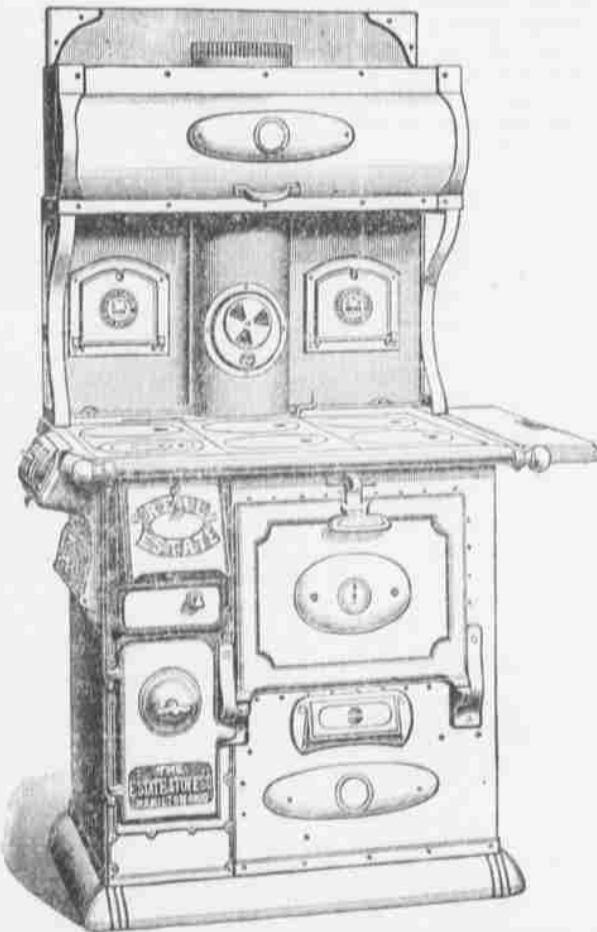
