The appointment was made upon the recommendations of the county judge of Yamhill county, the mayor of McMinnville, the president of the McMinnville Commercial Club and W. C. Hager. The experiment station is being established by an appropriation of \$10,000 for the purpose by the last legislature.

It is hoped to have Morgan establish a possible connection between the Guggenheim interests and the efforts of private monopolies and individuals to secure rich government lands in the far north.

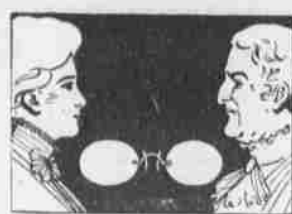

Johnson a Great Man. Cruzen, a prominent editor of Boise, Idaho, who is here today. Cruzen was fined and jailed by the Idaho supreme court for contempt recently because he published Colonel Roosevelt's criticism of the court's action in eliminating Roosevelt electors from the November ballot.
