The railroad commission will probably grant an order closing the offices, as there was no opposition.
At a meeting of the state land board yesterday T. B. Handly was appointed attorney for the board in Tillamook county to succeed Webster Holmes.
It was explained that of 67 offices sought to be closed about one-third were located in the woods and had been used by logging companies until they moved to a new location.
A meeting of the committee on accounts, the mayor and city attorney is scheduled for this afternoon, and it was predicted that the bid of Morris Bros., for the \$380,000 sewer bonds would be accepted.
One of the peculiar grounds upon which the Pacific States Telephone Co. yesterday asked that certain offices be closed by the railroad commission was that, as stated by Superintendent W. J. Phillips, that the work of certain agents was unsatisfactory. He explained this by the statement that the agents failed to turn over the receipts to the company, one retaining funds for six months. The company could get no one to take the places of the unsatisfactory agents and so had to close the offices.

Owing to a mistake a call was issued for a meeting last night for those interested in the organization of a Twilight ball club. The meeting will be held tonight, instead, at the Illibee club, and all those who are interested are urged to be present.
The state health board reports 448 males and 449 females born in March, 431 males and 381 females born in February and 453 males and 490 females born in January. Following deaths are reported: March 758, February 519, January 603. There were 313 marriages in March, 185 in February and 289 in January.
The state board of health's report shows the following statistics regarding infectious disease for March: Tuberculosis, 30 new cases and 57 deaths; measles, 27 new cases and two deaths; diphtheria, 24 new cases and 3 deaths; scarlet fever, 80 new cases and 2 deaths; smallpox 121 cases and no deaths; other infectious diseases, 35 cases and 6 deaths.
