NEW CONCRETE BRIDGE ON NORTH COMMERCIAL

A new steel and concrete bridge to cost in the neighborhood of \$10,000 will be constructed over Mill creek, on North Commercial street by the Portland, Eugene & Eastern Company, the work to begin probably June 15.

The railway company has made a large fill on both sides of the creek, and the bridge portion of the creek crossing to be built will not be of any great length, as it will serve the purpose of a span over the small stretch of water. The present bridge or trestle has been an eyesore to the public for several years, and the improvements which are being made by the company in that end of town are surely needed. A. J. Wagner, assistant engineer for the company, will superintend the work. The bridge material, which will consist of steel, cement and gravel, has already been ordered, and it will require about two weeks to finish job.
