

### SISTERS WILL HAVE A GOLDEN JUBILEE

Will Celebrate the Fiftieth Anniversary of the Community's Establishment Here

The Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary are making elaborate preparations for the celebration of their golden jubilee. Three days—June 9th, 11th and 12th have been set aside to fittingly observe the fiftieth anniversary of the community's establishment in Salem.

On Monday evening June 9th the alumni banquet will be held at the academy. On June 11th an informal reception will be tendered former pupils and it is anticipated that at this there will be a very large attendance.

On Thursday, June 12th, Pontifical high mass will be celebrated at St. Joseph's church, Archbishop Christie and numerous members of the clergy participating. Archbishop Christie will also deliver a sermon appropriate to the occasion.

At 1 o'clock on Thursday a banquet will be tendered Archbishop Christie, the clergy and other visitors and at 4 p. m., benediction will be held at St. Joseph's church. At 8 o'clock the jubilee and commencement exercises will be held at the opera house.

Sacred Heart Academy is recognized as one of the leading educational institutions on the coast. Its pupils have come from all parts of the west and they have all reflected great credit on the institution where they received their education. Catholics and non-Catholics alike, who have graduated from the Sacred Heart Academy all have a warm spot for this institution, and it is on such an occasion as this that both mind and heart will travel in retrospection to the old school days and the loyalty to their alma mater which will not down, will assert itself.
