FORMER BOSS COX ACCUSED OF CRIME

Ex-Czar of Cincinnati Accused, With Four Others, of Removing Big Note From Bank

(UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.) Cincinnati, Ohio, June 2.—The trial of George B. Cox, once political czar of Cincinnati, and four other officials of the Cincinnati Trust Company, charged with having removed a \$350,000 note from the assets of that bank, began here today.

Cox and his associates gave the note at the order of the state banking department to make up a shrinkage in the bank's capital. Later the trust company merged with another bank, and Cox and his associates withdrew the note.

Murdered by Unknown.

Bakersfield, Cal., June 2.—Murdered, wrapped in a blanket and placed on a pyre of sagebrush in the desert near Caliente, Cal., the body of a man whose identity is unknown to the authorities is held here today while a search is being made for his slayer. A Southern Pacific section hand found the body, still warm, the head crushed and bleeding, on a pile of sage brush that apparently had been fired but a few minutes before.
