DIAZ DENIES HE IS

Asserts There Is No Truth in Story Printed by Portland Telegram Regarding His Mission.

[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.] Portland, Or., Aug. 9.-Whether coincidence or not, two prominent Japanese are scheduled to go north on the Shasta limited at 3 o'clock this afternoon, the train which will carry General Felix Diaz and his party on the next lap of their journey to Japan.

The two Japanese, Dr. Juichi Soye da, formerly assistant minister of finance in Japan, and Tadao Kamita, honorary secretary of the Tokio chamber of commerce, are also booked to sail from Vancouver, B. C., next Wednesday on the Empress of Russia, the vessel which will carry General Diaz and his entourage.
