UNHAPPY WOMAN ENDS LIFE WITH POISON

Mrs. James Lansing Nervous Wreck and Unhappy After Four Months' of Married Life.

ALONE IN HOME WHEN SHE DECIDES TO END HER LIFE

Husband Returns From Trip to Find Note Stating That He Would Find Body in Tent.

Leaving a note to her parents declaring marriage was a failure, Mrs. James Lansing, a bride of four months, took her own life yesterday at the home of her father-in-law, C. F. Lansing, a wealthy nurseryman, Mrs. Lansing, who was 21 years old, wrote that she was a nervous wreck, that she was unhappy, and as she was unable to make a living for herself, had decided the best thing to do was to end her life.

Mr. and Mrs. C. F. Lansing left home early yesterday, and Mr. Lansing, Jr., left soon after for the home of a neighbor. When he returned last night at 6 o'clock he found a note in the kitchen giving him the information that his wife's body was in a tent in the yard. He telephoned to Dr. W. H. Ryd, who said the woman had been dead several hours. The husband is bordering on prostration, and declares he cannot account for the suicide.

Mrs. Lansing was the daughter of T. E. Hefley, whose home is on the Garden Road, near that of the Lansings. Mr. Hefley has been seriously ill for some time. He opposed the marriage of his daughter to Lansing, on the ground that her mother was in the East visiting, and that the couple should at least wait until her return. She was the only daughter of the couple.

NOTED CATHOLICS MEET IN ANNUAL CONVENTION

Chicago, Aug. 9.—Cardinal Gibbons arrived in Chicago yesterday en route to Milwaukee to preside over the meeting of the Federated Catholic Societies. He was met at the station by Archbishop Quigley, Bishop Duane, of Peoria, and Bishop O'Connell, of Richmond, Va.

Cardinal Gibbons will celebrate pontifical mass at the cathedral tomorrow and the Most Reverend J. Keene will preach the sermon. In the afternoon there will be a monster parade of all the Catholic societies of Milwaukee and vicinity and a concert will be given at the auditorium in the evening. An orchestra of over 1,000 singers will take part.

INCENSE LAW EFFECTIVE

Columbus, Ohio, Aug. 9.—Beginning today hunters in Ohio will have to come across with a dollar for a license. The law, which exempts land owners, their children and tenants, became effective today. It is the first hunters' license law the state has ever had. The open season for quail and pheasants has been extended to 1913 because the game has been slaughtered in such numbers in the past few years as to threaten extinction.
