His topic was “State Departments of Efficiency and Economy.” Governor Lister was only moderately enthusiastic himself over such department, but other governors denounced efficiency boards.

Governor Stewart, of Montana, insisted that “governors could appoint better men to spend money than the people could elect.” Governor Colquitt, of Texas, asserted that “efficiency boards only increase expenses and make more political machinery.”
