floor and I then beat the life out of her.

"I tried to throw her body out of the window, but it was so heavy that I could not handle it, so I laid it on the floor and piled books and literature over it. I took \$25 which she had in her purse and went to a place near my home, where I changed clothes. I buried the ones I took off."

Another Murder.

Harris also confessed to the murder of a Mrs. Haskins in Los Angeles two years ago.

"At that time I did not know her, either," he said. "I just had that desire to kill some woman. I rode to her house on my motorcycle and went to

the front door and asked for a 'Mr. Meyers.' She said she did not know any 'Mr. Meyers,' and I didn't either, for that matter. I then asked her for a drink of water, and she said for me to around to the back door and she would give it to me. I went to the back door and when she went to give a drink, I shot her. I then got on my motorcycle and rode away.

"I sent the poisoned candy to the Pierce children all right. I did it because I had had a quarrel with Mr. Pierce.

"I also sent a dynamite bomb to the Hershey Arms company because I had had some trouble with them, and when that did not do the work, I set fire to the Coronado hotel, which is next door to the Hershey Arms apartments."
