[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.] Rome, Nov. 7.—Despite the ever strained relations between the Italian government and the Vatican, the former today officially sanctioned a generous contribution for the erection of a magnificent cathedral at Tripoli. The state it is understood, is convinced that the winning over to the Catholic church of the Mohammedan population will greatly strengthen its position there politically. After the Italian government, Cardinal O'Connell, of Boston, is understood to have been the next heaviest contributor to the cathedral building fund. It is explained that much of the Boston cardinal's contribution was made up of small subscriptions from the poorer members of his cardinalate.
