## CELEBRATES WHILE HIS WIFE IS DYING IN HIS FARM HOME

John Sykes, a Polk county farmer, was man-handled Monday afternoon by Officer Welch, when the former attempted to resist arrest. Sykes was hopelessly intoxicated, and was arrested in a feed barn on High street. When the officer's line of persuasion wore out, he yanked Sykes out of a stall he had been sleeping in, and escorted him to the lockup.

While on the way to jail Sykes pleaded to be allowed to go to his home in Polk county, where, he said, his wife was lying in bed on the verge of death. He told Officer Welch that it was a shame to arrest a man when his wife was dying, and that, after he had slept off his drunk, he was going home. At first the officer thought Sykes was bluffing concerning his wife, but later, upon investigation, it was discovered that Mrs. Sykes is really on the verge of death, and that Sykes was telling the truth.

Sykes came to the city for provisions Monday morning and, as usual, partook too freely of that liquid refreshment which places the human feet cross ways. One of his neighbors attempted to induce the farmer to return to his home, but Sykes was obstinate and insisted upon sleeping in the feed barn stall and the proprietor thereof promptly called the police.

Last Saturday night Sykes was arrested on the same charge and forfeited \$10 he left with the officers as a bond to appear in court Monday morning. Judge Elgin yesterday fined Sykes \$50, which the man paid, and the court warned him that if he ever appeared again he would be sentenced to 30 days in jail.

## WIDOW AND CHILDREN GET MOST OF MONEY LEFT BY MORRIS

[UNITED PRESS LEASER WIRE.] Chicago, Nov. 12.—The will of the late Edward Morris, the Chicago packer, was filed here today. It disposed of an estate variously estimated at from \$20,000,000 to \$30,000,000.

The widow is given 26 2/3 per cent of the estate outright and an additional 15 1/3 per cent is placed in trust for her. The remainder of the estate, outside of several specific bequests, is to be divided equally and held in trust for the four children.

Hospitals and asylums benefited mostly from the \$200,000 bequeathed to charities.

### EASTERN MEAT PACKERS SEEK CORNER ON DAIRIES

[UNITED PRESS LEASER WIRE.] Portland, Ore., Nov. 12.—Eastern meat packers are after the dairy industry of the Pacific Northwest and an effort to "corner" the big creameries and milk depots has been under way for some time according to reports here today.

It was said that eastern packers have placed several million dollars at the disposal of organizers to carry the project to a successful termination.

It is stated that the Union Meat company, of Portland, which is said to be owned jointly by the Swift, Morris and Armour interests, has had organizers through the Willamette valley for several weeks in an effort to secure control of leading creameries and dairies.

Several leading creamery men acknowledged today they had been approached by persons representing themselves to be connected with the Union Meat company.

### SOUTHERN PACIFIC LAND CASE GOES UP HIGHER

[UNITED PRESS LEASER WIRE.] Portland, Ore., Nov. 12.—A bill of exceptions appealing the cases of 7,000 cross complaints and intervenors in the litigation between the government and the Southern Pacific railway over the Oregon and California land grant was filed in the federal court here yesterday by Attorney Lewis G. Garrigus. This is the formal notice of appeal of these litigations to United States circuit court of appeals. Formal decrees forfeiting the government 2,300,000 acres of land west of the Cascade mountains in Oregon and the California land grant were signed by Judge Wolverton July 1. The grounds for the appeal from Judge Wolverton's ruling allege 33 separate errors in his ruling. Most of the litigants live in Oregon.

### TO ELECTRIFY ROAD

[UNITED PRESS LEASER WIRE.] Milwaukee, Wis., Nov. 12.—Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul railroad officials announced today that contracts will soon be let for electrifying 113 miles of the Puget Sound division over the Bitter Root mountains. They said the plan was to electrify 100 miles of the system annually until the entire Puget Sound division has been electrified.

### FALLS UNCONSCIOUS WHILE TESTIFYING ABOUT SCANDAL

[UNITED PRESS LEASER WIRE.] New York, Nov. 12.—On the witness stand at the investigation District Attorney Whitman is conducting into the charges of Tammany corruption, George McGuire, a Syracuse contractor, fell unconscious from excitement yesterday afternoon and had to be carried from the court room.

McGuire had just admitted authorship of the famous telegram to Ex-Governor Sulzer's graft investigator, John Hennessy, signed "M" and mak-

### ing accusations against Tammany officials.

Following his collapse the investigation was adjourned until Thursday.

### QUARTET READY

A number of matches have been scheduled for each of the four during the winter.

### NEW GOLD FIELD

[UNITED PRESS LEASER WIRE.] San Francisco, Nov. 12.—Reports of the discovery of a rich new gold field about 100 miles back from Knik, Cook's Inlet, Alaska, were brought here yesterday by Captain Nielson, of the schooner C. T. Pill, arrived from Alaskan waters. He said a rush to the diggings was already on.

### BURGLAR ALARM

## DRUG FIEND ON TRIAL FOR MURDER ABUSES JUDGE BITTERLY

State's Attorney Hadley charged that Spencer was deliberately feigning insanity. He thinks the defendant is perfectly sane.

Spencer also abused Hadley, his own counsel and venemen.

### MILLION DOLLAR SUIT OF MRS. BLAKE OFF

[UNITED PRESS LEASER WIRE.] New York, Nov. 12.—Arthur Train, Mrs. Clarence H. Mackay's lawyer, issued a statement yesterday afternoon saying that Mrs. Joseph A. Blake's \$1,000,000 suit against his client for the alleged alienation of the affections of her husband, Dr. Blake, the famous surgeon, was about to be dropped without costs to either party. He insisted that Mrs. Mackay had not put money up to secure a settlement.

Mrs. Blake's suit for financial support and a separation from her husband has not been dropped but it was postponed a few days ago and it was still believed yesterday that the couple would be reconciled shortly.

Mrs. Mackay's husband recently served papers on his wife in connection with some sort of a legal proceeding but what they were was not divulged and there has been no further developments in the case.

### JOINT INCOME QUESTION

[UNITED PRESS LEASER WIRE.] Washington, Nov. 12.—Treasury officials were asked today whether they purpose to levy a double taxation in cases where a man and his wife both have incomes. Officials who were considering the matter, said joint incomes up to \$7000 probably would be exempted.

Oakland, Cal., Nov. 12.—Following a whirlwind courtship that spanned the continent and culminated in their marriage by a superior judge in Chicago, Elwood Cooper, southern California olive oil king and master of thousands of acres about Santa Barbara, aged 80 years, and his wife, formerly Mrs. Ada Fleming, of Denver, aged 60, arrived at the Hotel Oakland today, en route to Santa Barbara, where Cooper will break the news to his three children by a former wife. They will spend a day or two resting in Oakland before going south.

Walla Walla, Wash., Nov. 12.—Although a week ago she fled from Earl Tompkins, saying she could not marry him, Meda Lawrence, daughter of Professor N. W. Lawrence, returned Sunday, and, explaining her actions, by saying she was nervous, agreed to a consummation of the wedding last night. The numerous guests were re-invited and all arrangements made.

## COMET IS VISIBLE ON ANY CLEAR NIGHT

I. L. McAdam, local astronomer, has been studying Westphal's comet lately, and he has drawn an interesting map in which the exact location of the celestial visitor is shown. The comet is located between Cygnus and Dolphin, it appears, and on November 8 was at R. A. 20 H., 38 3-10 m. or D. E. A. 24 degree, 1 minute. In plain English the comet is to be seen on any clear evening a little east of north. It can be viewed with the naked eye, although it is not as large as Halley's. The comet last appeared in 1852.

### KING OF SCOWTOWN SENTENCED
