TACOMA MAY CONSTRUCT MUNICIPAL CAR LINE

[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.] Tacoma, Wash., Nov. 13.—After an agitation of eight months, the city council yesterday authorized a special election to be held within 30 days for the purpose of voting bonds of \$100,000 for the construction and operation of a municipal car line from the heart of the city to the manufacturing district on the tide flats.

An appeal will be made to women voters of the city to act as election judges without pay. A year ago the people voted to build the line, but rejected the bond issue of \$87,000 to finance the proposition.
