

FINANCIAL CONDITIONS IN OREGON ARE GOOD

State Bank Examiner Wright Shows Gratifying Financial Situation in This State.

GREAT INCREASE IN BANK DEPOSITS DURING PAST YEAR

Only Two New Banks Established During Period, But Banking Capital Increases Million and a Half.

That financial conditions in Oregon are healthy is reflected in a report of the conditions of the banking institutions at the close of business October 21, as announced by Will T. Wright, state bank superintendent, today. Mr. Wright says the statement is one of the most gratifying ever made in the history of the department. It will be the last one this year, and virtually is a report of the conditions for the year.

In comparison with a statement of November 20, 1912, the one nearest to the date of the call this year, material increases are shown in all departments, that in cash and bank balances being \$3,286,519.25. The increase in deposits is \$7,840,558.24 and in bank savings is \$1,874,465.16. In postal savings the increase is \$307,140.76. The combined savings are \$2,181,605.86. The total resources are \$169,462,883.08.

All Banks Show Gains. "The report shows," said Mr. Wright, "an unusually healthy financial condition. Substantial gains have been made by all the banks, the increase in cash and reserve being especially large. With only two new banks

established during the year, the banking capital has increased nearly \$1,500,000."

Deposits in Portland banks increased. There were 170 state banks and 86 national banks at the close of business October 21, while there were 171 state banks and 83 national banks when the final report was made last year.

NON-PARTISAN JUDICIARY SYSTEM FAVORED BY BAR

Before adjourning at Portland, the Oregon State Bar Association passed a resolution in favor of a non-partisan judiciary system by a vote of 35 to 25.

ASSISTANT ENGINEER OF P. E. & E. LINE IS KILLED

[UNITED PRESS LEARNED WIRE] Eugene, Or., Nov. 21.—Robert F. Smithwick, of Portland, Or., assistant engineer on the Portland, Eugene & Eastern railroad, was killed instantly at 1 o'clock yesterday afternoon at Porter, a railroad crossing on the Portland, Eugene & Eastern lines, 12 miles north of Eugene, when a gasoline speeder upon which were Mr. Smithwick and two companions crashed into an automobile. M. B. Whitney, of San Francisco, a special representative of the Southern Pacific railroad, and J. G. Youkum, of Albany, Or., an employe of the Portland, Eugene & Eastern, were slightly injured.

The automobile contained four men connected with a local real estate firm. All escaped injury. The automobile was on the track when the speeder dashed down at terrific speed. So great was the impact that Smithwick was hurled 30 feet and fell, his skull being crushed, probably from impact with a rail.

EVIDENCE AGAINST CREED NOT AT ALL CONCLUSIVE

[UNITED PRESS LEARNED WIRE] San Francisco, Nov. 21.—The United States circuit court of appeals today has upheld Judge Duollings' fine of \$2,000 against Secretary David C. Norcross or go to jail until he turns over the company's books to the federal grand jury for inspection.

The trial of the company's eight officials on charges of complicity in an alleged conspiracy by which the prosecution says the government was short weighted out of about \$1,000,000 on coal for federal use, has been set for December 9.

While the grand jury investigation of the case was in progress Norcross was called on to produce the books. He refused on the ground that the district attorney was using the grand jury as an adjunct in prosecuting the company.

- 4 eggs
 - 1 cup granulated sugar
 - 1 cup milk
 - 1 teaspoonful butter
 - 1 teaspoonful cornstarch
 - 1 pinch salt
 - 1 pint stewed and strained pumpkin
 - 1 teaspoonful ginger
 - Nutmeg or cinnamon if desired
 - 1/2 teaspoonful Mapleine
- Use regular pie crust and bake in moderate oven. Enough for two pies.

 - 3 cups hominy.
 - 4 cups flour
 - 4 1/2 cups ground coffee.

 - Chocolate
 - Ice cream
 - Custard

- To scald milk: Set the vessel con-

taining the milk in hot water. Let it remain till bubbles form around the edge of the inner vessel. Do not let a scum form on the milk.

A good cook is always a good manager, and will make a meal out of what an inferior cook wastes.

Too much salt toughens vegetables. Strong smelling vegetables, such as cabbage and onions, should be cooked uncovered in a great quantity of water, covering only condenses and strengthens the odor, and when the lid is lifted this spreads through the house.

To blanch vegetables, pour boiling water over them, let stand a minute, then pour off and cover with ice water. This not only insures cleanliness, but improves the flavor.

How often we hear a woman say, "I never prepared this dish for so many persons before, and I don't know just what proportions to use, so it is not as good as usual." This would not be the case if she used accurate measurements at all times. These can always be intelligently added to, or subtracted from, as the need may be.

Corn Bread.

- 3 cups corn meal.
 - 1 egg (last).
 - 1/2 teaspoon soda.
 - 2 teaspoons baking powder.
 - 1/4 teaspoonful salt.
 - Add sour milk.
- Mix dry ingredients, stir in enough sour milk to make a batter which will pour, but is not too thin. Add egg last. Pour in Crisco pan and bake.

ment of the body. Dried peas and beans contain the tissue-building element, protein. Green vegetables furnish minerals and acids. The tubers furnish starch, which gives heat and energy to the body.

All fresh vegetables should be washed thoroughly to remove all earth, insects, etc. A scrubbing brush is very useful for this cleaning.

Green vegetables should be put in cold water until ready to cook. Strong vegetables, as cabbage, onions and turnips should be cooked in a large quantity of boiling salted water; and the cover should be left off the pot.

Canned vegetables should be removed from the can as soon as opened; and, if possible, have the water drained off and the vegetables washed thoroughly.
