Mr. McMahan is one of the leaders of this party in the state, and was prominently connected with its organization and campaign at the last election. Prior to casting his fortunes with this party, he was affiliated with the Republican party, and as a republican served a term in the legislature.

With a division existing in the ranks of the Republicans, and the Democrats in a hopeless minority, he recently declared that the prospects of the Progressive party winning at the polls were good, and declared himself confident that with a strong ticket in the field, it would win.

## DENIES WILSON IS SICKER THAN IS ADMITTED AT WHITE HOUSE

Washington, Dec. 13.—Private Secretary Tumulty denied this afternoon reports that President Wilson's condition is worse than had been admitted.
