TRANSFER CHARGE IS ENJOINED BY COURT
[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.]
San Francisco, Jan. 7.—Judge Sewell today made permanent an injunction issued in 1908 restraining the Commercial Pacific Cable company from making a transfer charge on messages filed with the Western Union to be sent to the orient from San Francisco or elsewhere where the two companies are in competition.

The Western Union represented the Commercial charged only for exactly what the sender wrote on messages filed at its own offices, but in the case of those who filed through the Western Union, inserted "via San Francisco" and the date of transmission, charge \$1 per word for doing it.

ALL BALTIMORE AND OHIO STOCK TO BE DISTRIBUTED
[UNITED PRESS LEASED WIRE.]
New York, Jan. 7.—The executive committee of the Union Pacific railroad decided yesterday afternoon that all Baltimore and Ohio stock, owned by the Union Pacific, must be distributed among the holders of common stock as a dividend. It decided to recommend such a distribution and \$3 per share in cash to the company directors at its meeting here on Thursday.

If the plan is followed, the active committee will also recommend that the regular annual dividend be reduced from ten to eight per cent. The Union Pacific owns \$53,607,000 of Baltimore and Ohio common stock and \$28,840,000 of its preferred stock.
