Corvallis, Or., March 23.—P. J. Knapp, an employe of the Corvallis Sand & Gravel company, was drowned in the Willamette river near the gravel bankers Saturday afternoon. He was a single man and about 25 years of age. Mr. Knapp and E. A. Collier, superintendent of the gravel company, had been at work at the bankers, and put out in a rowboat to go to a scow in the river on which the gravel is loaded from a hoist, for the purpose of shifting its position. The river is very swift where the gravel is being taken out and in some manner the boat was capsized.

#### KING REFUSES AID.
