M'GRAW ANGERED AT ATTEMPTS OF OUTLAWS

Federal League Is Trying to Get "Mac's" Players to Jump Contracts.

ALL BUT MEYERS ARE SIGNED FOR THREE YEARS

Leach Cross Says He Will Have A Easy Time with Freddie Welch the Britain.

New York, April 24.—Manager McGraw, of the Giants, was "all bet up" here today over attempts by the pesky Federals to take Milton Stock, his new third baseman, to the outlaws. Speaking of reports that several of his players were about to jump to the new organization, McGraw said:

"Any player who would jump the Giant's for a hazardous outlaw league proposition is certainly lacking in gray matter. The Giants have won three pennants in a row now and ought to capture a fourth this year, so I cannot see why any of my players should be anxious to get away. The velvet acruing from the world's series looks pretty good to them.

"Every regular player on my team excepting Meyers has a three year contract, and we are thoroughly profited. Meyers is serving the last season of a two year contract."

The players who have been mentioned as possible jumpers are McLean, Marquand, Murray, Doyle, Snodgrass and Stock.

Writing from Los Angeles to his brother Phil, Leach Cross declares his belief that Freddie Welch will prove easy for him.

"I am going to carry the fight to Welch like I did to Willie Ritchie," writes Leach. "I know that by wading into him I will have a better chance of landing my blows."

NO TEAM IS ORGANIZED

MANAGER BAKER OF LAST YEAR SAYS THAT HE WILL NOT TAKE THE LEAD.

Who wants to manage Salem's baseball team this season? All the other valley towns are planning to have a baseball team but so far no steps in that direction have been taken in this city.

Manager Baker of last season's squad stated this morning that he had positively decided not to organize a team this year. He gave as his reason the fact that there was no place to play. The old grounds used last season are in poor condition and he does not care to go to the merchants and ask for the large amount of money necessary to fix up the old grounds only to have them in a similar condition again next spring.

Several prominent fans had been contemplating forming a stock company and buying and equipping grounds but the matter seems to have been dropped.

There is much good baseball talent in the city that could be collected for such a team and the experience of the past two seasons is that the fans are present in no small number and will respond readily if good ball games are offered.

There is still plenty of time to organize a good team and make all the necessary arrangements for having a season of good ball games here but according to leading fans the indications just at present are anything but favorable.

WATER FOR DAIRY COW.

Water requirements of the dairy cow are not always given the attention they ought to receive. Aside from the large amount of water used in milk production cows will drink about 60 to 80 gallons a day if they are given that amount of fresh, clean water. Some of the world's record cows have drunk as much as 270 gallons a day. Since milk has a large percentage of water in it large quantities of water are required to produce the milk. Not only that, but high milk production demands the digestion and assimilation of a great deal of nourishment, and water is needed in large quantities for these purposes. The best water is from springs or deep wells, says W. A. Barr, O. A. C. and Federal dairy agent. Ponds receiving

drainage are especially bad, because they contain disease germs and because the water is not filtered so that the cow really drinks all she needs.

CHARGED WITH VIOLATING TERMS OF HIS PAROLE

Penitentiary authorities say that E. L. Cameron alias J. H. Campbell, a paroled prisoner who has been conducting a carriage painting shop on Ferry, between High and Liberty

streets, has violated the privileges extended him by the prison parole board, by leaving the city without first notifying the members of the board.

Cameron was serving a three-year term for forgery committed in Multnomah county and was paroled shortly after he was committed to the institu-

tion. He started a paint shop on Ferry street and sent east for his family to come out. His wife and children arrived and everything went along smoothly until last Saturday when the paroled man was found missing.

The prison authorities are anxious to find Cameron as he was given more

than usual parole privileges and they say he leaves his family in destitute circumstances.

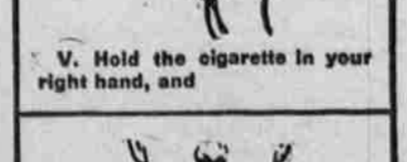
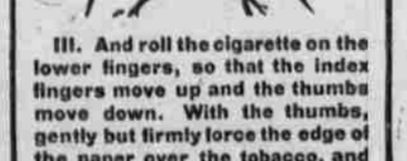
