## EXTENSIVE FIELD TESTS IN LIMING SOUR SOILS

Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, Or., April 28.—In co-operation with the department of Agronomy at the Agricultural College 120 farmers of the Willamette Valley and the Coast counties are making extensive field tests in the value of ground limestone to acid soils. The purpose of the tests is to secure reliable data of the effects and profits of lime on sour soils, and to ascertain the outside prices that may be paid for ground limestone that is used at a profit.

If these experiments demonstrate the agricultural value of lime at prices that it may be produced for, its use on sour soil would be greatly stimulated with resulting gain to crop production throughout the region affected. Based on laboratory tests conducted by Professor H. D. Scudder, the policy of applying lime to acid soils will be profitable at prices not to exceed \$3 per ton for the ground limestone. With a sufficient supply at this price or less, it is believed by Professor Scudder that farmers of the Willamette Valley alone would consume 100,000 tons of ground limestone annually.

The deficiency of lime produces conditions undesirable in many ways. The chief injury, according to Professor Scudder, is due to its unfavorable action in the development of nitrogen-gathering bacteria. This bacteria, which are closely associated with the legumes in extracting nitrogen from the air, prefer a sweet or alkaline soil. Other advantages of lime are its effects on the physical condition of the soil and in releasing plant food not otherwise available.
