CARLSBAD HAS A DISTINGUISHED ROYAL VISITOR

Carlsbad, June 1.—King Gustav of Sweden is Carlsbad's most distinguished sojourner just at present. The king has almost completely recovered from the operation he underwent for stomach trouble at Stockholm recently and his visit here was only undertaken to put the finishing touch on his cure. It is said his majesty's illness probably would not have resulted fatally in any case, but that the operation has had a wonderfully beneficial mental effect, since it removed the fear Gustav unquestionably felt that he was suffering from cancer of the stomach. PORTLAND HAS FIRE

Portland, Ore., June 1.—In a spectacular fire which threatened the famous forestry building, and a number of nearby residences, the California building on the Lewis and Clark 1905 world's fairgrounds was totally destroyed early today. The value of the California building was not great, except for what it might yield wreckers. A light wind carried showers of sparks for blocks in every direction. The roof of the forestry building caught three times but the flames were extinguished by firemen.

NOME SEASON OPENS

Seattle, Wash., June 1.—One thousand people will leave Seattle today and tomorrow for Nome, Alaska, on the first vessel carrying passengers and cargoes to the northern ports this season. The steamship Senator, with 391 passengers, sailed from here this morning on the way to Nome. The steamship Victoria will sail tomorrow with 658 passengers. Both vessels carry large cargoes of provisions and general merchandise for Nome, St. Michael and other northern ports, which are waiting the coming of the ships from the outside, after the winter period which shuts in the north from the world.

COLLISION VICTIM MAY DIE

Vallejo, Cal., June 1.—Though the doctors pronounced his injuries very serious, there were hopes today of saving the life of John Poling, of Napa, who, with six other residents of the same place, was in an automobile which collided Saturday evening with a Southern Pacific locomotive at the five-mile crossing on the Napa road. Poling's right leg was crushed and he suffered internal hurts. His companions were cut and bruised. The party was on its way to a gathering here of Woodmen of the World.

PROFESSOR SAYS POPULATION WILL SHIFT TO TROPICS

Seattle, Wash., June 1.—Wholesale migration to tropical lands is predicted by Professor John A. Winzler, of the science department of the University of Washington here today.
