### Late Yesterday

Reno, Nev.—Miners found nearly \$150,000 sacked ore in an abandoned drift of the National mine.

San Francisco.—With appropriate ceremonies ground was broken for the Illinois pavilion on the 1915 exposition grounds.

Brussels.—The Union of International Peace associations recommended a world's congress in San Francisco in 1915.

Santa Clara, Cal.—Father Ricard predicted California would have warmer weather in July, with several periods of more than usual heat.

Santa Cruz, Cal.—Woodford Kron of San Francisco, was killed under his automobile which had skidded over a 40 foot embankment.

San Francisco.—Word was received that Mrs. Theodore Forbes of San Francisco had been drowned while bathing in the Russian river near Mesa Grande.

San Francisco.—His wife sued for divorce from O. E. Morris, a blind, paralyzed beggar, charging cruelty and saying Morris collects \$6 to \$8 daily and

has a \$1,000 bank account. Albany, N. Y.—Chairman Barnes, of the Republican state committee, received a letter from Senator Root saying the latter will not be a candidate for re-election.

Gilroy, Cal.—News was received that Harry Schmel of Gilroy had been killed, and J. A. Phippen of San Jose and William South of Santa Clara badly injured when their automobile went through a bridge across the Pacheco river.

Venice, Cal.—The town trustees prohibited rraging in cafes and ordered drums banished from cafe orchestras.

Los Angeles, Cal.—Searching for a guinea pig's tail to shake it to see if the animal's eyes would drop out, Gerald Sloan, aged 15, was severely bitten, losing the end of a finger.

Los Angeles, Cal.—Announcement was made that the division headquarters for the field service of the general land office for California, Arizona and New Mexico, will be removed to Phoenix.

### ANOTHER FAKE STORY OF POISONED NEEDLES

Long Beach, Cal., July 1.—Police detectives are searching today for a Japanese who is believed to have attacked with a "poison needle" Miss Grace Herrington, aged 19, the daughter of a Methodist minister. The girl collided with the Japanese in a business street and almost at once became ill. She was on the verge of fainting, she said, when she met a friend and asked his aid. A physician found the mark of the needle on her body.

### SEATTLE TURNS DOWN COMMISSION GOVERNMENT

Seattle, Wash., July 1.—The proposed charter, providing for a qualified city manager form of government, stand defeated today by approximately 13,000 votes to 7,365.

The vote at yesterday's election was light but entirely decisive.

Under the proposed charter, a city manager was to have been appointed by a council of 30, elected from wards.
