CORRI STILL BUSY CHEWING THE RAG

In Making So Many Excuses for His Decision as to Cause Much Comment as to Its Correctness.

SEEMS TO THINK DESIGN NEEDS MUCH EXPLANATION

Other Sport Matters However Are Taking Public Interest in Other Directions Away from Fluke.

London, July 18.—Out of all the controversy over the unsatisfactory ending of Thursday night's ring battle between Gumbert Smith and Georges Carpentier, in which the latter was given the decision on a foul in the sixth round, the most startling fact definitely established today was that Smith actually was down for 14 seconds before the bell sounded in the fourth round, when he was floored by Carpentier.

J. T. Hull, official timekeeper, declared he called Referee Eugene Corri's attention to the fact that Smith had been knocked out. He said Corri refused to entertain his claim that Carpentier had won then and there.

Both sides, it was stated, however, had agreed before the fight to let Corri do the counting. The referee asserted that as he told off the nine counts he did his best to make them accord with the actual seconds.

Smith Admits Foul. Regarding the claim that Carpentier was automatically disqualified by the fact that his manager, Deschamps, leaped into the ring before a decision was rendered, Corri said: "I was quite prepared to let the fight go on if Carpentier could get up. I have been blamed for being too severe, but as a matter of fact I had no desire to end the contest until I saw the Frenchman had been badly punished by the foul blow."

Smith settled all discussion as to whether he struck Carpentier while the latter was on the canvas by admitting today that he probably did, but he maintained that there was no force be-

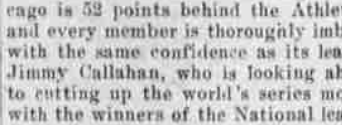

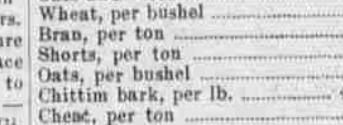
