London, Sept. 19.—(By mail to New York.)—Whether the French really are using turpentine is a matter of wide-spread speculation in England. This new explosive is declared to be so deadly that all life is exterminated within a radius of 400 yards of one of the exploding shells.

As Though Petrified. "When, 10 minutes later, I reached the pen, the sheep looked for all the world as if they had been petrified. They were mostly standing up, one against the other. Three or four were lying down, but all were dead, with their eyes open and lips hanging."
