

GERMANS CLAIM GAINS.

Berlin, via The Hague, Oct. 24.—The German right wing's offensive was being maintained everywhere, it was announced officially here today, and in places it was said the kaiser's troops had made material gains.

In the vicinities of Arras, Lille, along the Gser canal and south of Dixmode the allies were reported as having proved smable to check the Teutonic advance and along the Meuse it was declared German progress was being made everywhere, while the bombardment of Verdun continued steadily. The Vienna general staff was quoted to the effect that the Austrians were repelling the Russians along the Sun south of Przemysl.

TO LIBERATE ITALIANS. Rome, Oct. 24 .- Russia has formally offered to liberate and send to Italy all the prisoners of war it has taken who are from Austria's Italian provin-ces, it was announced here today. Na-tives of the Trieste and Trent districts were mentioned especially. All the exar naked in return was a piedge from the Italian government to keep these troops in Italy until the end of the war.
