SWIPED THE DIAMONDS.

San Francisco, Oct. 27.—Charged with using the mails to defraud immigrants, Walter E. and Ralph H. Schurz, of the Tobin Park Development company, were arraigned before United States Commissioner Krull here today and released on \$1000 bail each for a further hearing tomorrow. The two men are alleged to have made several thousand dollars by selling to immigrants lots on the Ocean Shore railroad, representing the lots to be near the city. It is charged they sold 300 lots which are practically worthless to the owners.
