

## WOULD STOP TAKING THE STATE'S CENSUS

Unless some provision is made by the legislature, through which some benefit can be derived by the state under the act of the legislature of 1885, which provides that a census of the state shall be made every ten years, alternately with the federal censuses, Secretary of State Olcott is in favor of wiping the law off the statutes entirely because, in its present form, it operates not only as a nuisance, a useless burden of expense upon the taxpayers and the data that is collected is never compiled for there is no provision of the statute requiring it.

The law of 1885 provides that the assessors of the several counties take a census of the population of the state upon the fifty year of each decade and to file the results with the secretary of state. This was done 10 years ago and the reports from the several counties still lie in the basement of the state house and have never been compiled for there is no law requiring it nor funds available to pay for such work. F. L. Kent, field agent of the bureau of Agriculture, and a Mr. Jones, also connected with the federal department, held a conference with Mr. Olcott recently regarding the matter and they advised that, inasmuch as the government was going to take an agricultural census of the state during the fall of 1915, the state statute requiring a state census every ten years is useless unless it be changed to require that an agricultural census be taken every year.
