BULGARIA WANTS IT

Sofia, Bulgaria, Nov. 25.—Members of the Agrarian, National and Liberal parties in the grand sohanje, or Bulgarian national legislature, urged the formation today of a non-partisan ministry to approach the allies upon the question of permitting Bulgarian troops to occupy Macedonia, under an agreement whereby Bulgaria will help Serbia to repel the Austrians.

FRANCE IS GAME

Washington, Nov. 25.—The American embassy at Paris cabled the state department this afternoon that France will reproduce the famous picture of the Legion of Honor at the Panama-Pacific exposition. Historic French tapestries and furniture, it was said, will be exhibited.

FOREST FIRE SPREADS

Santa Monica, Cal., Nov. 25.—A rapidly spreading forest fire was burning late today in Dry canyon, north of Santa Monica. Fire wardens, accompanied by 100 fire fighters, have gone to the fire line. Motion picture companies with plants in the canyon above Santa Monica will send several hundred fighters tonight.

New York, Nov. 25.—Richard Croker, aged 71 years, former leader of Tammany Hall, will marry a Mrs. Dickson Thursday morning at St. Agnes Catholic church here. Miss Agnes Brennan will officiate. Croker has been a widower but three months.
