PROFESSOR INDORSES WHOLESALE MURDER

Seattle, Wash., Dec. 1.—Germany will assuredly win in the great conflict now raging.

So declared Professor Eugen Kuehnemann, head of the department of philosophy at the University of Breslau, Germany, speaking yesterday in the first of a series of lectures at the University of Washington.

"We will win in this war; we will win the decisive battles now being fought. We want a just existence for the German nation. We want this, that German idealism—'my, survive,' he said."

"The highest right of man is to be a soldier. Military duty is a service one renders to a state; it is a duty. There is no more important eternal duty for the individual man than to live and die for his fatherland. In this great crisis, we have seen beyond a doubt that power is necessary for the survival of a nation. There is no nation which cherishes and respects its ideals which would not fight to uphold them to the last man."
