W. W. MOORE BUYS VALUABLE PROPERTY. Well Known Furniture Company Will Have Modern Home for Business.

A real estate transfer of more than ordinary importance has just been made public in the announcement that the property fronting on the north side of Court street, near the corner of Liberty, has been sold by Frank W. Durbin to W. W. Moore, of the firm of Jones & Moore, furniture dealers.

It is the plan of the new owner, Mr. Moore, to remove the old house this summer and erect a modern and strictly high-class business block that is to cover the full size of the property, 60 x 40, and to be four stories in height, with a deep basement.

The creation of such a building on this portion of Court street will have a decided effect on the attraction of business to that quarter of the downtown district, and the improvement will be welcomed by the tenants and property owners there.

Mr. Moore has been a resident of Salem only about five years, but during that time he has become actively identified with the commercial life of the city.
