Cattle—This week's market opened steady to strong in all classes. Prime steers sold at \$8.00, cows at \$6.80 and other grades in proportion. Market closing steady.

Hogs—With a beginning of \$6.80 Monday which was 15c over the close of last week, hogs have maintained this level, although all other American markets have shown a decided weakness. North Portland being the highest by 10 cents.

Sheep—The strength of the sheep market has been able to bring somewhat increased receipts this week. Prices have advanced a lamba reached \$7.30, ewes \$6.75. Outlook strong.
