**21 Lumber Ships to Load in Gray's Harbor**

Aberdeen, Wash., Feb. 3.—The sudden revival of the lumber industry is shown by the fact that 15 sailing vessels are now in Gray's Harbor awaiting cargo, with eight more due in a few days, so that there will be 21 lumber ships in port at one time, the largest number in many years.

**STORM BLOCQUE CONTINUES.**  
Chicago, Feb. 3.—The ice blockade along the Illinois-Wisconsin lake shore was well nigh complete today. Ice-bound in Lake Michigan were nineteen ships of various sizes. Eighteen are in the ice at various points between here and Milwaukee. The Alabama of the Goodrich line, despite heroic efforts on the part of Captain Redding, failed to get out last night, and today is as helpless as an infant. With an additional drop in temperatures predicted it is feared the boats may be tied up for several weeks.
