Oregon Students Maintain High Averages in English

University of Oregon, Eugene, March 4.—Ten Oregon high schools, of which Lincoln, Washington and Jefferson, of Portland, were three, sent students to the University of Oregon in the freshman class of last September, of whom were made a grade lower than M (medium) in freshman English composition.

In number, the Portland schools led Jefferson high having 14, Washington high 14 and Lincoln high 5. The other seven were represented as follows: Astoria and Grants Pass, 5 each; Hood River, 4; La Grande, Roseburg, Riddle and the Klamath County high school, 3 each. The disparity in numbers makes comparisons unfair, but the three students from Riddle, with one H (honorary) and two S (superior) grades, produced the best showing for their school. The Salem high school with 8 students had only one below M, as had the high school of Medford, also with 8 freshmen.

The total number of entering freshmen in September was about 300. In February came 65 more.

A reorganization of the work in freshman composition at the university is contemplated. Under the proposed plan freshmen will be divided into sections in accordance with their proficiency, which proficiency is to be determined by an examination after registration. The "English defectives" will be put into a separate class for special drill. It is hoped that this segregation
