### Contractor Hughes Springs **New Surprise Upon Board** of School Directors

An entirely new phase was presented in relation to the controversy between the school board and Contractor S. A. Hughes, over the acceptance of the new chimney, when Mr. Hughes delivered a letter to the board, at last night's adjourned meeting from W. G.

livered a letter to the board, at last night's adjourned meeting, from W. G. McPherson, the heating expert of Portland, the substance of which was that if the inside measurements of the chimney varied 25 per cent from the specifications it would make no material difference in the efficiency of the flue, and, in order that the matter be settled once and for all and to the satisfaction of all concerned, it was decided to call in Mr. McPherson, John Bingham, chimney builder of Portland, and EnGineer A. E. Strange to pass upon the efficiency of the chimney and when this is done the board will be in position to effect a settlement with Contractor Hughes.

This matter has been up before the board for several meetings past and

This matter has been up before the board for saveral meetings past and the principal bone of contention, or stumbling block in the way of a settlement, has been that the chimney was shy two and one-half inches inside measurement according to specifications, which provided for a 24-inch inside diameter which the building committee convessed of Nicester. committee, composed of Directors Buren and Barnes, protested while Contractor Hughes maintains that it was a physical impassibility to follow the exact inside metsurements with the materials stip-ulated in the specifications and there ulated in the specifications and there
the matter has cested for the past two
weeks. The board called Engineer
Strang, of the insune asylim and he
rendered a report to the effect that,
according to the surface measurements
of the furnace gates, a chimney capacity of 24 inches square inside measurement would be required.

When Mr. Hughes, who had consult
ed Mr. McPherson, who furnished the
board with the original estimate upon

board with the original estimate apon the flue capacity, presented the lat-ter's letter to the board, which was, in effect, that "were the inside diameters 25 per cent less in area than speci-fied and all other points in the speci-fications followed, the chimney would still have sufficient capacity for the work intended to be accomplished, the board was again "up in the air" and as the memchers were divided in opinion it was concluded that no decision could be reached until the chimney had been inspected and reported upon directly with the recommendations from the ex-

Director Barnes' chief objection seems to be that the contractor should be punished for not following the strict letter of the specifications, while Director Buren thinks the contractor ought to be penalized for the differ-ence in measurements and for the sav-ing made in leaving out the 'headers' as specified, but Director Lee took the
