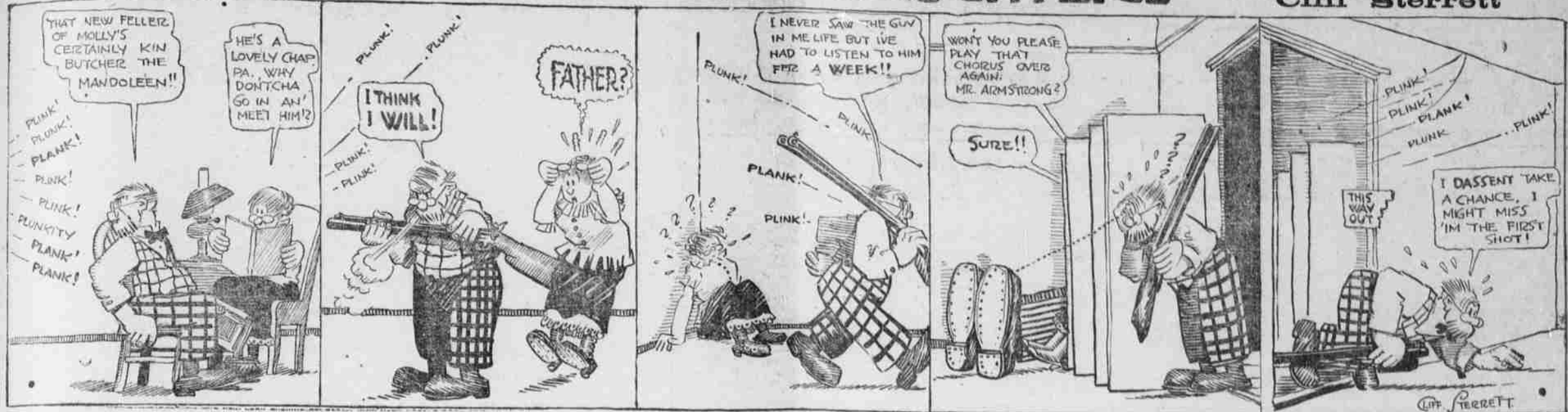

### Indians Must Not Kill Unlucky Medicine Men

Fresno, Cal., April 22.—If the Indian tribes in this vicinity promise to stop killing their medicine men who supposedly have the evil spirit, Charley Davis, the Indian who murdered Doctor Jack, medicine man, will be paroled. This is the situation here following Davis' plea of guilty to a charge of manslaughter entered today. He has applied for probation.

Davis killed Doctor Jack after two of his children had died in spite of the medicine man's efforts to save them. The slayer said he killed Jack to keep him from doing mischief to more members of the Davis family. In the opinion of Davis, the medicine man was possessed of an evil spirit.

The murder charge was reduced to manslaughter, whereupon the confession and plea for mercy were made. A delegation of white mountaineers testified that Davis was a good Indian.

However, the authorities want to convince the redskins that the custom of removing those who have evil spirits is not a good practice, so they have determined to hold Davis in jail until his fellow braves agree to stop slaughtering medicine men.

The tribe will pay wov May 1 with the county authorities at Dunlap, at which time and place the proposition is to be discussed from all angles.

### Big Naval Battle May Now Be On

Copenhagen, April 22.—A squadron of German battleships is now in the North sea, apparently waiting for the appearance of British vessels and prepared to give battle, according to Scandinavians arriving here today.

The Politiken suggested the possibility of an engagement soon by the publication of the statement that it had received positive word that an allied squadron had been sighted north of Jaedens Reed, Norway. The squadron was headed north, it was stated.
